ABOUT THE PROJECT

The project's main aim is to promote the inclusion of LGBTQI+ youth through the creation of understanding and inclusive youth work experiences and spaces. This aim will be reached by transferring specific competences to youth workers. The main objective of the project is to transfer specific competences about LGBTQI+ people to youth workers both working and not working directly with LGBTQI+ youth.

OBJECTIVES

- -To provide the necessary competences to include a positive approach to Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity and Expression in youth work practice, also referring to the Youth Workers competence model.
- -To explore the specificities and challenges of working with LGBTQI+ young people in Education settings and European activities.
- -To look at the difficulties that LGBTQI+ young people face and how practitioners can become facilitators for positive change or growth.
- -To provide a framework of action and a series of tools to challenge discrimination on the basis of SOGI.
- -To offer a space for inquiry and personal growth of participants.
- -To reach citizens, foster diversity and non discrimination.




LOCATION AND ACCOMMODATION

The Youth Exchange will take place in Alpignano and Torino, the most beautiful cities of North Italy.

The participants will be staying in hostels with:

- shared rooms (3/4 people)
- private bathroom
- common areas
- coffee bar
- free wi-fi















You can arrive 2 days before the activity or depart 2 days after, if you want to spend more time in Italy on your own. Accommodation costs and food for the extra days is not covered by the project funds.

Please make sure to arrive till **3 PM** on the first day of the program (gathering spot: Torino Porta Susa, more details will be provided soon).

You can easily reach Torino by train (https://www.trenitalia.com/) or Flixbus (https://global.flixbus.com/).

Torino also has an airport, but you can check Milano and Bergamo flight connections too. Your organization can help you find the best solution. Choose your itinerary and share it with us.

Please check with us before purchasing and don't book any ticket without our expressed confirmation.

According to our National Agency rules, we can't reimburse taxi or private cars, Only public transport will be accepted.




FINANCIAL CONDITIONS AND REIMBURSEMENT

IMPORTANTE




In order to ensure the safest and most enjoyable experience for everyone, during the whole Youth Exchange we will follow health care directives and prevention rules, according to current Italian law.

February in Turin should be with average temperature varying between -0.7°C (30.7°F) and 9.1°C (48.4°F), the average relative humidity in February is 75%.


