What?

"Share the Rainbow" aims to be a training course focused on youth workers and their daily practice involving gender inclusiveness and support to LGBTQ+ people and the community. We also aim to help build bridges between youth workers and participating associations so that more effective, sustainable, and accelerated change can take place. Youth workers will learn from each other and lead change together. Within such training, they will be bringing the benefits of collaboration back to their community.

"Share the Rainbow" aims therefore to provide participants with the necessary competences to include sexual orientation and gender identity (SOGI) in their youth work practice, and to combat prejudice and discriminatory attitudes towards the LGBTQ+ community.



Objectives:

- To promote equality, solidarity and social inclusion among all, especially on the basis of gender identity and different sexual orientation;
- To support youth workers with knowledge and activities to improve the inclusion of LGBTQ+ youth in their organizations and provide a safe space;
- To facilitate intercultural learning among participants from different EU and partner countries, exchanging information on LGBTQ+ reality in different countries while building international partnership and co-operation;
- To strengthen the capacities of youth workers and their NGOs to actively participate in society on the debate of human rights by providing tools and activities for campaigning acceptance of diversity and equality, contributing to the development of a sense of European citizenship.

About us

Our aim is to give opportunity to our youngsters/youth workers to train themselves so that they can have impact on local communities.

You?

The course is designed for youth workers, youth leaders, youth educators, social workers, NGO workers and representatives of our organizations as well as partner organizations. Those working with young people and who would like to expand their practice or career to be more gender-inclusive, expanding their youth work practice for LGBTQ+ youth.

Each partner organization will intend to include at least one participant with fewer opportunities or difficulties to adapt to the society who are looking for opportunities to improve their skills and work in the youth field.

The profile of the participants is as following:

- Resident in the country of their sending/receiving organization;
- Age 18+;
- Priority will be given to participants with follow-up project ideas;
- Those, who are working directly with youngsters and are motivated to support the LGBTQ+ community;
- Basic level of English language;
- An interest in gender issues, LGBTQ+ rights, equality & inclusion, queer activism, campaigning and advocacy (no previous experience is required);
- Readiness and availability to involve in the project actively and dedicate time and effort to it;
- Newcomers in the Erasmus+ programme are highly welcomed.



Practicalities

Location:

To ensure maximum safety of the group, we will share the exact location and more details about the project venue only with selected participants. The accommodation is well-experienced by the organizing team and the quality of the service, food and accommodation will satisfy the needs of participants and project activities. Three meals will be provided daily, accustomed to the needs of the participants (f.e.vegan, vegetarian, halal...)

Arrival and departure:

The project team will provide transportation from the meeting point in Tbilisi, to and from the project venue in Georgia. Therefore we ask participants to arrive in Tbilisi before 3PM on the arrival day and plan their departure after 2 pm

Deadline selecting participants: 3rd of October Deadline buying the tickets: 17th of October



COVID-19 regulations:

At the current moment there are NO COVID-19 regulations in order to enter Georgia, the project team will update you in case of any changes.

Project costs and reimbursement

STEPS for reimbursement:

- 1. After selection, you can start looking for travel options
- 2. Send your travel proposal to: sharetherainbow.projectegmail.com
- 3. Wait for our confirmation before you buy the tickets!
- 4. You will receive a link where to upload your tickets
- 5. Keep ALL paper boarding passes and tickets with you and hand them over during the project
- 6. Participants will be reimbursed after all the reports will be sent and approved by the National Agency (please note that this process can take up to 2 months after the project finishes).

100% of accommodation, food and transportation during the project will be covered with the support of Erasmus+

It is necessary for participants to have a travel health insurance that is valid in Georgia (not covered by project).

Only the most economical transport will be reimbursed! Travel must be economy/second class for a train, plane or bus ticket. No taxi costs can be refunded.
